Biography

Mark Takla is an Assistant United States Attorney for the United States Attorney's Office in the Central District of California. He currently prosecutes domestic and international terrorism cases in the National Security Section.

He received his B.A. in Criminology, Law, and Society from the University of California, Irvine in 1998 and his J.D. from University of California, Los Angeles in 2001. While in law school, he served as Managing Editor of the UCLA Law Review. After law school, he clerked for the Honorable Harry L. Hupp and the Honorable Consuelo B. Marshall, both of the United States District Court for the Central District of California.

In 2002, he reported for active duty in the United States Navy's Judge Advocate General's Corps. After graduated from Naval Justice School, Newport, Rhode Island, he served as a Trial Counsel and Assistant Chief Trial Counsel at the busiest prosecution shop in the Navy in Norfolk, Virginia. While in Norfolk, he tried nearly every type of case, including murder, rape, child sexual abuse, embezzlement, identity theft, online solicitation, and child pornography. He was also lead counsel on a national security case and secured the Navy's first espionage conviction in 10 years. In 2005, he deployed to Afghanistan with SEAL Team TEN in support of Operating ENDURING FREEDOM. He provided legal advice to the unit whose mission was to find and capture Al Qaida and Taliban leaders.

In 2007 following his tour in Norfolk, he was assigned to the Office of the Judge Advocate General, Criminal Law Division (Code 20) in Washington, DC where he assisted in the establishment of criminal justice policy in the Navy. He was also an Adjunct Professor at the United States Naval Academy in Annapolis, Maryland.

In July 2008, he left active duty and joined the United States Attorney's Office in Santa Ana, California.

He remains a Navy reservist. From 2008 through 2011, he was the Staff Judge Advocate for Naval Special Warfare Group ELEVEN and SEAL Teams SEVENTEEN and EIGHTEEN. He is currently assigned to Naval Reserve Region Legal Service Office SOUTHWEST.

Dr. Sayegh has conducted postgraduate research in speech recognition for improving medical productivity among physicians, and has co-authored 2 published papers in the areas of Information Systems and Applications in the Medical Field, and Mobile Work and Wireless Companies.

In addition to owning and operating a Computer Retail & Consulting company, Professor Sayegh has been employed by such organizations as NASA at JPL, Wangtek Drive Systems, Ferranti Aerospace Missile Systems, Hewlett Packard, Computer City, Micropolis Drive Systems, Mercy College, National University, Hope International University, and Argosy University.
